Scholarship Program C

The Matamoras Chapter O.E.S. # 261 will award (1) \$500 Scholarship (boy or girl) under the Eligibility Criteria of Program C. For your application to be considered you must meet the following conditions:

1. Applicant must be the son, daughter, or grandchild of a member of the Matamoras Chapter O.E.S #261 in good standings.
2. Applicant must be a High School Senior pursuing a Bachelor or Associate Degree at an accredited University, College, Technical or Post Secondary Vocational School. He/She must be a full time student taking 12 semester or 18 quarter hours.
3. Applicant's High School GPA must be at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 point scale). A copy of the transcript of high school grades must be sent to the Scholarship Chairperson.
4. Applicant must take the ACT Test and have received a score of at least 18.
5. Applicant must turn in 3 letters of recommendation. Letters need to be written by educators, clergy, or other community leaders. The letters need to emphasize the importance of moral character, compassion and respect for others and leadership qualities. Copies of the letters need to be attached with other information sent to the Scholarship Chairperson.
6. Applicant needs to understand that the \$500 scholarship will be awarded in the form of a single payment sent directly to the student or parents (after the completion of the first quarter or semester of attending college). The student needs to send the Chairperson a copy of his/her grades with proof of receiving a minimum of a 2.0 average before receiving the Scholarship of \$500.
7. Applicant needs to understand that the Scholarship is not renewable and must be initiated within one year of the April 1 deadline.
8. Applicant needs to understand that the Scholarship will be based on achievements during grades 9-12 in the following areas: (A) Scholastic Achievement (B) Personal Achievements in school activities such as awards & honors received; Display of Leadership: Membership in different clubs and organization; sports, music, offices held, plays, etc. (C) Services and volunteer work in the church and community (D) Three letters of recommendation need to illustrate the importance of moral character, compassion and respect for others , and displays of leadership in school, church and community. (E) A 250 word or more Essay titled " Why it is important to respect my Elders"
9. The 250 word essay must be sent to the Scholarship Chairperson along with all the other required information be the April 1 dead line. The Matamoras Masonic Lodge # 374 Scholarship Committee will determine all qualifications. A committee member will present Scholarship to the Winner at the Awards Assembly.
